### **Pupil Premium Spend 2017/2018**

Our pupil premium allocation for the financial year 2017/2018 is £125, 980

It is our aim to ensure that the pupil premium funding has a positive impact upon pupil progress and the standards achieved by our pupils across the whole school.

The money will be used in the following ways:

Funding English and Mathematics interventions delivered by qualified teachers;	£26, 354
Contribution to teacher support assistants to deliver targeted support during literacy and numeracy lessons;	£34, 659
Funding a Learning Mentor to work with our more vulnerable pupils;	£23, 528
Funding an Assistant SENCO to help support our SENCO in ensuring that all pupils are receiving appropriate interventions;	£26, 613
Funding a Classroom Assistant to support reading across the school	£9, 826
Purchasing books for all pupils to support Differentiated Texts (one book per child per term)	£5, 000
Total	£125, 980
