


World Book Day Update – Thursday 2nd March

School Uniform and Overall Presentation

The vast majority of our children attend school correctly dressed for the school day with appropriate footwear, no earrings or other jewellery and hair tied back. Can we also ask that your child's name is written inside all school uniform so that we can return misplaced or forgotten items to children quickly and easily.

School Meals

Did you know that extra money comes into the school budget for each child who claims free school meals? Your child can still bring a packed lunch to school but the claim triggers extra funding for our school

If you are on Income Support or income based Job Seekers Allowance your child is entitled to a free school meal.
