
We hope all pupils have an enjoyable bank holiday weekend and half term holiday. We look forward to welcoming all children back for the final half term on Monday 6th June.




School Office and Staff Update


Sun Safety


School Uniforms

School Uniform Reminder

Even though the weather is now getting warmer our school uniform policy remains the same.

- Trainers are not allowed and children will be asked to change into black pumps if trainers are worn.
- Children need to be free of jewellery (especially necklaces, chains, earrings and bracelets). It is okay to wear a watch
- Long hair needs to be tied back
- Black sensible shoes should be worn not trainers or strappy sandals
- Tramlines or mohicans are not allowed
- Summer dresses and shorts are allowed
- Skirts and dresses need to be a suitable length

If your child arrives to school complying fully with the uniform policy shown above they will receive a DoJo. If your child comes to school inappropriately dressed we will contact you so that you can bring the correct uniform to school.
