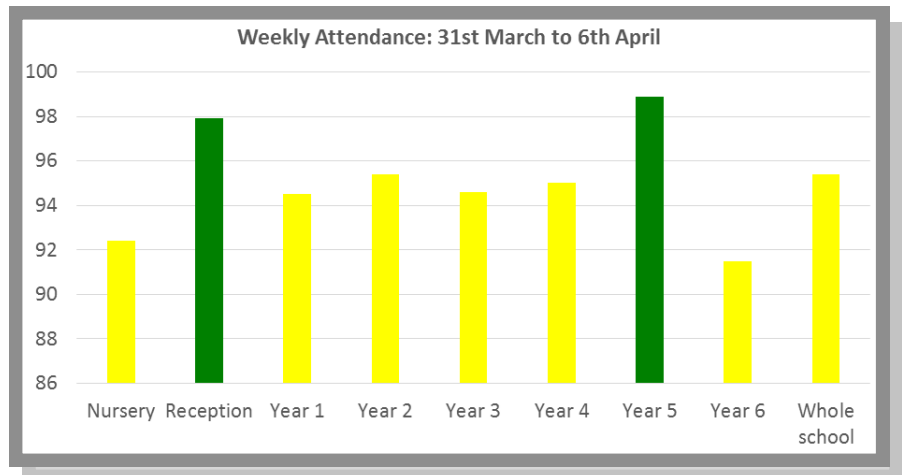
Learning with God and Each Other to Be the Best We Can Be

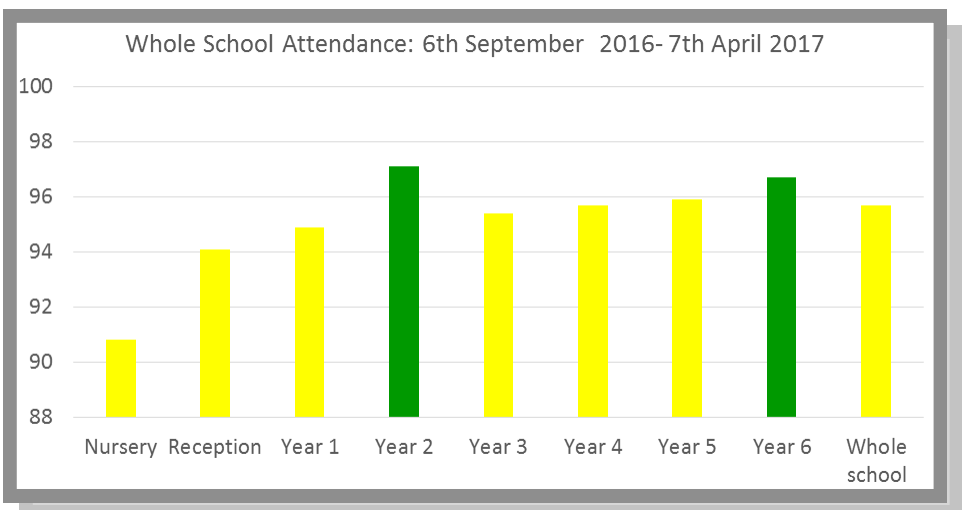

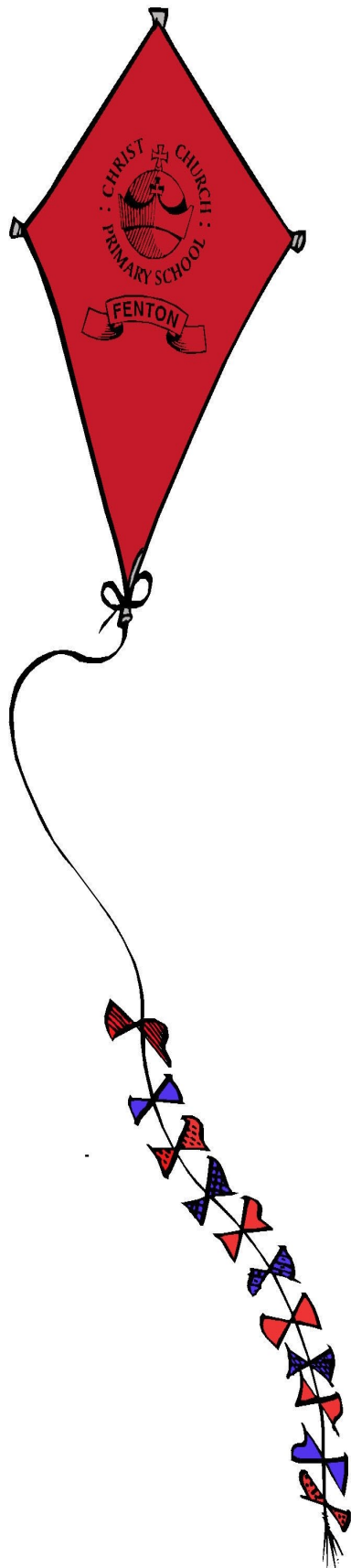

School Meals

Did you know that extra money comes into the school budget for each child who claims free school meals? Your child can still bring a packed lunch to school but the claim triggers extra funding for our school

If you are on Income Support or income based Job Seekers Allowance your child is entitled to a free school meal.
